SUMMARY

THE FOLLOWING SUMMARY ANSWERS SOME QUESTIONS THAT YOU MIGHT HAVE REGARDING THE SECURITIES IN GENERAL TERMS ONLY. IT DOES NOT CONTAIN ALL THE INFORMATION THAT MAY BE IMPORTANT TO YOU. YOU SHOULD READ THE SUMMARY TOGETHER WITH THE MORE DETAILED INFORMATION THAT IS CONTAINED IN THE REST OF THIS PRICING SUPPLEMENT AND IN THE ACCOMPANYING PROSPECTUS AND PROSPECTUS SUPPLEMENT. YOU SHOULD CAREFULLY CONSIDER, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE MATTERS SET FORTH UNDER THE HEADING "RISK FACTORS." IN ADDITION, WE URGE YOU TO CONSULT WITH YOUR INVESTMENT, LEGAL, ACCOUNTING, TAX AND OTHER ADVISORS WITH RESPECT TO ANY INVESTMENT IN THE SECURITIES.

WHAT ARE THE SECURITIES?

The Securities are senior notes issued by us, ABN AMRO Bank N.V., and are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by our parent company, ABN AMRO Holding N.V. The Securities are linked to the performance of the SPDR Trust, Series 1, an exchange traded fund which we refer to as the Underlying Fund. The Securities have a maturity of 12 months. The payment at maturity of the Securities is determined based on the performance of the Underlying Fund, subject to a cap, as described below. UNLIKE ORDINARY DEBT SECURITIES, THE SECURITIES DO NOT PAY INTEREST. IF THE FUND RETURN IS ZERO OR UP TO AND INCLUDING -10% YOU WILL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE ONLY THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$1,000 PER SECURITY AT MATURITY. IN SUCH A CASE, YOU WILL RECEIVE NO RETURN ON YOUR INVESTMENT AND YOU WILL NOT BE COMPENSATED FOR ANY LOSS IN VALUE DUE TO INFLATION AND OTHER FACTORS RELATING TO THE VALUE OF MONEY OVER TIME. IF THE FUND RETURN IS LESS THAN -10% YOU WILL SUFFER A LOSS AND YOU COULD LOSE UP TO 100% OF YOUR INITIAL PRINCIPAL INVESTMENT. IF THE FUND RETURN IS POSITIVE YOU WILL NEVER RECEIVE MORE THAN A PREDETERMINED AMOUNT PER SECURITY WHICH IS EQUAL TO THE REDEMPTION AMOUNT. THE MAXIMUM REDEMPTION AMOUNT WILL BE SET ON THE PRICING DATE.

WHAT WILL I RECEIVE AT MATURITY OF THE SECURITIES AND HOW IS THIS AMOUNT CALCULATED?

At maturity you will receive, for each \$1,000 principal amount of Securities, a cash payment calculated as follows:

- (1) If the fund return is positive, \$1,000 plus the out-performance amount; or
- (2) If the fund return is equal to or less than 0% up to and including -10%, \$1,000; or
- (3) If the fund return is less than -10%, then \$1,000 plus [(fund return) + 10%] x 1.1111 x 1,000].

ACCORDINGLY, IF THE FUND RETURN IS LESS THAN -10%, AT MATURITY YOU WILL RECEIVE LESS THAN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$1,000 PER SECURITY AND YOU COULD LOSE UP TO 100% OF YOUR INITIAL PRINCIPAL INVESTMENT. IF THE FUND RETURN IS POSITIVE, YOU WILL NEVER RECEIVE A PAYMENT AT MATURITY GREATER THAN THE MAXIMUM REDEMPTION AMOUNT. THE MAXIMUM REDEMPTION AMOUNT WILL BE SET ON THE PRICING DATE.

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WHAT IS THE OUT-PERFORMANCE AMOUNT, THE PARTICIPATION RATE AND THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT AND HOW ARE THEY CALCULATED?

For each \$1,000 principal amount of Securities, the out-performance amount is an amount in cash equal to the lesser of: (a) the participation rate times the fund return times \$1,000 and (b) the maximum amount.

The fund return is the percentage change in the fund price, over the term of the Securities, calculated as:

$$\frac{\text{Final Price} - \text{Initial Price}}{\text{Initial Price}}$$

WHERE,

- o the initial price is the closing price of the Underlying Fund on the pricing date; and
- o the final price is the closing price of the Underlying Fund on the determination date.

The participation rate is 4.00 (or 400%).

The maximum amount will be set on the pricing date and will be no less than 22% and no more than 28% of \$1,000.

We call the Securities "10% Buffer Securities due January 29, 2010 Linked to the Performance of the SPDR Trust, Series 1" because of the limited buffer against a negative fund return of up to and including -10%. If the fund return is less than 0% and up to and including -10%, you will receive your entire principal amount at maturity. If the fund return

is less than -10% you could lose up to 100% of your initial principal investment.

HOW IS THE FUND RETURN CALCULATED?

The fund return will be equal to:

$$\frac{\text{Final Price} - \text{Initial Price}}{\text{Initial Price}}$$

The initial price is 100% of the closing price of the Underlying Fund on the pricing date.

The final price is 100% of the closing price of the Underlying Fund on the determination date.

CAN YOU GIVE ME EXAMPLES OF THE PAYMENT I WILL RECEIVE AT MATURITY DEPENDING ON THE PERFORMANCE OF THE UNDERLYING FUND?

EXAMPLE 1: If, for example, in a hypothetical offering, the initial price is \$90.00, the final price is \$110.00, the participation rate is 4.00 (or 400%) and the maximum amount is \$250.00, then the fund return would be calculated as follows:

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$$\frac{\text{Final Price} - \text{Initial Price}}{\text{Initial Price}}$$

or

$$\frac{\$110.00 - \$90.00}{\$90.00} = 22.22\%$$

In this hypothetical example, the fund return is positive. Therefore, the payment at maturity will be calculated as:

$$\$1,000 + \text{the out performance amount}$$

the out performance amount will be equal to the lesser of:

- (a) the participation rate x fund return x \$1,000, and
- (b) the maximum amount

or

- (a) $400\% \times 22.22\% \times \$1,000 = \$888.89$, and
- (b) \$250.00

Therefore, in this hypothetical example, the out performance amount will be \$250 since \$250 is less than \$888.89. As a result, you would receive at maturity the principal amount of \$1,000 plus \$250.00, for a total payment of \$1,250 for each \$1,000 principal amount of Securities. In this hypothetical example, the fund return was 22.22% but you would have received a return of 25% over the term of the Securities because the maximum amount is \$250.00 which is 25.00%.

EXAMPLE 2: If, for example, in a hypothetical offering, the initial price is \$90.00 and the final price is \$83.00, then the fund return would be calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Final Price} - \text{Initial Price}}{\text{Initial Price}}$$

or

$$\frac{\$83.00 - \$90.00}{\$90.00} = -7.78\%$$

In this hypothetical example, the fund return is negative. Since the fund return is less than 0% but higher than -10% you would receive, at maturity, the principal amount of \$1,000 per Security.

In this hypothetical example, the fund return was -7.78% and you would not have lost any of your initial principal investment because the fund return was between 0% and -10%. In this hypothetical example you would not have received any return on your initial principal investment and you would not be compensated for any loss in value due to inflation and other factors relating to the value of money over time.

EXAMPLE 3: If, for example, in a hypothetical offering, the initial price is \$90.00 and the final price is \$65.00, then the fund return would be calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Final Price} - \text{Initial Price}}{\text{Initial Price}}$$

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Initial Price

or

$$\frac{\$65.00 - \$90.00}{\$90.00} = -27.78\%$$

In this hypothetical example, the fund return is negative and is less than -10%. Therefore, payment at maturity will be calculated as:

$$\$1,000 + [(fund\ return + 10\%) \times 1.1111 \times \$1,000]$$

or

$$\$1,000 + [(-27.78\% + 10\%) \times 1.1111 \times \$1,000] = \$802.45$$

Therefore, in this hypothetical example, you would receive at maturity a total payment of \$802.45 for each \$1,000 principal amount of Securities. In this hypothetical example, the fund return was -27.78% but you would have lost 19.76% of your initial principal investment over the term of the Securities.

WILL I RECEIVE INTEREST PAYMENTS ON THE SECURITIES?

No. You will not receive any interest on the Securities.

WILL I GET MY PRINCIPAL BACK AT MATURITY?

YOU ARE NOT GUARANTEED TO RECEIVE ANY RETURN OF PRINCIPAL AT MATURITY. IF THE FUND RETURN IS LESS THAN -10% OVER THE TERM OF THE SECURITIES, YOU WILL LOSE SOME OR ALL OF YOUR INITIAL PRINCIPAL INVESTMENT AND YOU COULD LOSE AS MUCH AS 100% OF YOUR INITIAL PRINCIPAL INVESTMENT. Subject to the credit of ABN AMRO Bank, N.V. as the issuer of the Securities and ABN AMRO Holding N.V. as the guarantor of the issuer's obligations under the Securities, you will receive at maturity any cash payment to which you are entitled, under the terms of the Securities.

HOWEVER, IF YOU SELL THE SECURITIES PRIOR TO MATURITY, YOU WILL RECEIVE THE MARKET PRICE FOR THE SECURITIES, WHICH COULD BE ZERO. There may be little or no secondary market for the Securities. Accordingly, you should be willing to hold your securities until maturity.

IS THERE A LIMIT ON HOW MUCH I CAN EARN OVER THE TERM OF THE SECURITIES?

Yes. If the Securities are held to maturity and the Underlying Fund appreciates, the total amount payable at maturity per Security is capped at the

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maximum redemption amount. The maximum redemption amount will be set on the pricing date.

WHAT IS THE MINIMUM REQUIRED PURCHASE?

You may purchase Securities in minimum denominations of \$1,000 or in integral multiples thereof.

IS THERE A SECONDARY MARKET FOR SECURITIES?

The Securities will not be listed on any securities exchange. Accordingly, there may be little or no secondary market for the Securities and, as such, information regarding independent market pricing for the Securities may be extremely limited. You should be willing to hold your Securities until the maturity date.

Although it is not required to do so, we have been informed by our affiliate that when this offering is complete, it intends to make purchases and sales of the Securities from time to time in off-exchange transactions. If our affiliate does make such a market in the Securities, it may stop doing so at any time.

In connection with any secondary market activity in the Securities, our affiliate may post indicative prices for the Securities on a designated website or via Bloomberg. However, our affiliate is not required to post such indicative prices and may stop doing so at any time. INVESTORS ARE ADVISED THAT ANY PRICES SHOWN ON ANY WEBSITE OR BLOOMBERG PAGE ARE INDICATIVE PRICES ONLY AND, AS SUCH, THERE CAN BE NO ASSURANCE THAT ANY TRADE COULD BE EXECUTED AT SUCH PRICES. Investors should contact their brokerage firm for further information.

In addition, the issue price of the Securities includes the selling agents' commissions paid with respect to the Securities and the cost of hedging our obligations under the Securities. The cost of hedging includes the profit component that our affiliate has charged in consideration for assuming the risks inherent in managing the hedging transactions. The fact that the issue price of the Securities includes these commissions and hedging costs is expected to adversely affect the secondary market prices of the Securities. WHERE CAN I FIND OUT MORE ABOUT THE UNDERLYING FUND?

Because the Underlying Fund is an investment company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, the Underlying Fund is required to file periodically certain financial and other information specified by the Commission which is available to the public. You should read "Public Information Regarding the Underlying Fund" in this Pricing Supplement to learn how to obtain public information regarding the Underlying Fund and other important information. The historical highest intra-day price, lowest intra-day price and last day closing price of the Underlying Fund for each quarter since 2003 are set forth under the heading "Public Information Regarding the Underlying Fund" in this Pricing Supplement.

TELL ME MORE ABOUT ABN AMRO BANK N.V. AND ABN AMRO HOLDING N.V.

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ABN AMRO Bank N.V. is an international banking group offering a wide range of banking products and financial services worldwide through our network of offices and branches. ABN AMRO Holding N.V. is the parent company of ABN AMRO Bank N.V. Holding's main purpose is to own the Bank and its subsidiaries. All of the Securities issued by the Bank hereunder are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by Holding.

On November 2, 2007 a consortium (the "Consortium") of the Royal Bank of Scotland Group plc, Fortis SA/NV and Fortis N.V. (collectively, "Fortis"), and Banco Santander Central Hispano SA, which had made a tender offer for the shares of Holding, announced that approximately 98.8% of the shares of Holding had been tendered to the Consortium as of October 31, 2007. On September 22, 2008 the Consortium acquired the remaining shares of Holding. On October 3, 2008 Holding jointly announced with the Dutch Minister of Finance (the "Minister") that on that date the Minister acquired all shares of Fortis Bank Nederland (Holding) NV from Fortis, which effectively transferred Fortis' share in Holding to the State of the Netherlands.

Holding is no longer listed on Euronext or the New York Stock Exchange but files periodic reports with the SEC. ABN AMRO Bank N.V. is rated A+ by Standard & Poor's and Aa2 by Moody's. "See "Risk Factors--Changes to Our Credit Ratings May Affect the Market Value of Your Securities."

WHO WILL DETERMINE THE FINAL PRICE, THE FUND RETURN AND THE PAYMENT AT MATURITY?

We have appointed our affiliate ABN AMRO Incorporated, which we refer to as AAI, to act as calculation agent for Wilmington Trust Company, the trustee for the Securities and Citibank, N.A., the securities administrator. As calculation agent, AAI will determine the final price of the Underlying Fund, the final price, the fund return and the payment at maturity. The calculation agent may be required, due to events beyond our control, to adjust any of these calculations, which we describe in "Description of Securities - Adjustment Events; - Discontinuance of the Underlying Fund; Alteration of Method of Calculation" in this Pricing Supplement.

WHO INVESTS IN THE SECURITIES?

The Securities are not suitable for all investors. The Securities might be considered by investors who:

- o are willing to risk losing all of their initial principal investment in exchange for the opportunity to benefit from a capped percentage of the appreciation, if any, in the price of the Underlying Fund over the life of the Securities;
- o do not require an interest income stream;
- o are willing to be exposed to fluctuations in equity prices in the form of an exchange traded fund in general and the price of the Underlying Fund in particular; and
- o are willing to hold the Securities until maturity.

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE RISKS IN OWNING THE SECURITIES?

Investing in the Securities involves a number of risks. We have described

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the most significant risks relating to the Securities under the heading "Risk Factors" in this Pricing Supplement which you should read before making an investment in the Securities.

Some selected risk considerations include:

- o MARKET RISK. If the fund return is between zero and -10%, you will be entitled to receive only the principal amount of \$1,000 per Security at maturity. In such a case, you will receive no return on your investment and you will not be compensated for any loss in value due to inflation and other factors relating to the value of money over time. If the fund return is less than -10%, you could lose up to 100% of your initial investment.
- o CREDIT RISK. Because you are purchasing a security from us, you are assuming our credit risk. In addition, because the Securities are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by Holding, you are assuming the credit risk of Holding in the event that we fail to make any payment required by the terms of the Securities.

If the price of the Underlying Fund decreases by more than -10% during the term of the Securities, the amount of cash paid to you at maturity will be less than the principal amount of the Securities and could be zero.
- o LIQUIDITY RISK. If you sell your Securities in the secondary market, if any, prior to maturity, you will receive the market price for the Securities, which could be zero. The Securities will not be listed on any securities exchange. Accordingly, there may be little or no secondary market for the Securities, and information regarding independent market pricing for the Securities may be very limited or non-existent. The value of the Securities in the secondary market, if any, will be subject to many unpredictable factors, including then prevailing market conditions.

The guarantee of Holding will constitute Holding's unsecured and unsubordinated obligations and rank pari passu without any preference among them and with all Holding's other present and future unsecured and unsubordinated obligations. You can find a general description of our ABN Notes(SM) program in the accompanying Prospectus Supplement. We also describe the basic features of this type of note in the sections called "Description of Notes" and "Notes Linked to Commodity Prices, Single Securities, Baskets of Securities or Indices".

The Securities are not principal protected debt and unlike ordinary debt securities, the Securities do not pay interest. There is no guaranteed return of principal. Investing in the Securities is not the equivalent of investing directly in the Underlying Fund. This section describes the most significant risks relating to the Securities. YOU SHOULD CAREFULLY CONSIDER WHETHER THE SECURITIES ARE SUITED TO YOUR PARTICULAR CIRCUMSTANCES BEFORE YOU DECIDE TO PURCHASE THEM. IN ADDITION, WE URGE YOU TO CONSULT WITH YOUR INVESTMENT, LEGAL, ACCOUNTING, TAX AND OTHER ADVISORS WITH RESPECT TO ANY INVESTMENT IN THE SECURITIES.

THE SECURITIES ARE NOT ORDINARY SENIOR NOTES; THE SECURITIES DO NOT PAY INTEREST AND THERE IS NO GUARANTEED RETURN OF PRINCIPAL

The terms of the Securities differ from those of ordinary debt securities in that we will not pay you interest on the Securities and you could lose up to 100% of your initial investment at maturity. If the fund return is between zero and -10%, you will receive only your principal amount back at maturity, but if the fund return is less than -10%, you will receive less than your principal amount and could receive zero. ACCORDINGLY, IF THE FUND RETURN IS LESS THAN -10% ON THE DETERMINATION DATE, THE AMOUNT OF CASH PAID TO YOU AT MATURITY WILL BE LESS THAN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF THE SECURITIES AND COULD BE ZERO.

Furthermore, even if the fund return is positive, the return you will receive on the Securities is subject to a cap and may be less than the return you would have received had you invested your entire principal amount in a conventional debt security with the same maturity issued by us or a comparable issuer. The return you will receive on the Securities, if any, may be minimal and may not compensate you for any losses incurred due to inflation or the value of money over time. We cannot predict the future performance of the Underlying Fund based on historical performance.

INVESTMENT IN THE SECURITIES IS NOT THE SAME AS A DIRECT INVESTMENT IN THE STOCKS THAT COMPRISE THE S&P 500 INDEX(R) OR IN THE SPDR TRUST, SERIES 1

An investment in the Securities is not the same as a direct investment in the stocks (or any other securities) that comprise the S&P 500 Index(R) or in the SPDR Trust, Series 1. This is due in part to the fact that the calculation agent does not adjust the valuation of the Underlying Fund, and therefore the return on the Securities, for the payment of cash dividends on the stocks (or any other securities) that comprise the S&P 500 Index(R) or the stocks held by the SPDR Trust, Series 1. In addition, the return on your Securities could be less than if you had invested directly in the stocks (or any other securities) comprising the S&P 500 Index(R) or held by the Underlying Fund because you will only participate in the change in the price of the Underlying Fund over the term of the Securities, the return on the Securities does not account for the return associated with the reinvestment of dividends that you would have received if you had invested directly in the stocks (or any other securities) comprising the Underlying Fund and because there are management fees charged by the Underlying Fund. You will not receive any payment of dividends on any of the stocks (or any other securities) comprising the Underlying Fund.

ADJUSTMENTS TO THE UNDERLYING FUND COULD ADVERSELY AFFECT THE VALUE OF THE SECURITIES

The objective of the Underlying Fund is to provide investment results that correspond generally to the price and yield performance, before fees and

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expenses, of the S&P 500 Index(R). The Underlying Fund at any time will consist of as many stocks which comprise the S&P 500 Index(R), which we refer to as Index Securities, as is practicable. Periodically, Standard & Poor's, a division of The McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc. ("S&P") which is the Sponsor of the S&P 500 Index(R) may (i) determine that total shares outstanding have changed in one or more component Index Securities due to secondary offerings, repurchases, conversions or other corporate actions; (ii) determine that the available float shares of one or more of the Index Securities may have changed due to corporate actions, purchases or sales of securities by holders or other events, or (iii) replace one or more Index Securities due to mergers, acquisitions, bankruptcies, or other market conditions, or if the issuers of such Index Securities fail to meet the criteria for inclusion in the S&P 500 Index(R). The Underlying Fund aggregates certain of these adjustments and changes the composition of the Underlying Fund at least monthly. Any of these actions could adversely affect the prices of the Index Securities and/or the Underlying Fund and, consequently, the value of the Securities.

MARKET PRICE OF THE SECURITIES INFLUENCED BY MANY UNPREDICTABLE FACTORS

The value of the Securities may move up and down between the date you purchase them and the maturity date. Several factors, most of which are beyond our control, will influence the value of the Securities, including:

- o the price of the Underlying Fund, which can fluctuate significantly;
- o interest and yield rates in the market;
- o the volatility (frequency and magnitude of changes in price) of the stocks comprising the Underlying Fund;
- o economic, financial, political, regulatory, judicial or other events that affect the stocks comprising the Underlying Fund or stock markets generally, and which may affect the price of the Underlying Fund;
- o the time remaining until the maturity of the Securities;

- o the dividend rate on the stocks that comprise the Underlying Fund. While dividend payments, if any, on the stocks that comprise the Underlying Fund are not paid to holders of the Securities, such payments may have an influence on the market price of such stocks and therefore on the Underlying Fund and the Securities; and
- o the creditworthiness of the Bank as issuer of the Securities and Holding as the guarantor of the Bank's obligations under the Securities. Any person who purchases the Securities is relying upon the creditworthiness of the Bank and Holding and has no rights against any other person. The Securities constitute the general, unsecured and unsubordinated contractual obligations of the Bank and Holding.

Some or all of these factors will influence the price that you will receive if you sell your Securities prior to maturity in the secondary market, if any. If you sell your Securities prior to maturity, the price at which you are able to sell your Securities may be at a discount, which could be substantial, from the principal amount. For example, there may be a discount on

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the Securities if at the time of sale the price of the Underlying Fund is below its initial price or if market interest rates rise. Even if there is an appreciation in the price of the Underlying Fund from its initial price, there may be a discount on the Securities based on the time remaining to the maturity of the Securities. **THUS, IF YOU SELL YOUR SECURITY BEFORE MATURITY, YOU MAY NOT RECEIVE BACK YOUR ENTIRE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT.**

Some or all of these factors will influence the return, if any, that you receive upon maturity of the Securities. You cannot predict the future performance of the Securities, the Underlying Fund or the stocks that comprise the Underlying Fund based on the historical performance of the Underlying Fund or of the stocks which comprise the Underlying Fund. **NEITHER WE NOR HOLDING NOR ANY OF OUR AFFILIATES CAN GUARANTEE THAT THE PRICE OF THE UNDERLYING FUND WILL INCREASE SO THAT YOU WILL RECEIVE AT MATURITY AN AMOUNT IN EXCESS OF THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF THE SECURITIES.**

CHANGES TO OUR CREDIT RATINGS MAY AFFECT THE MARKET VALUE OF YOUR SECURITIES

Our credit ratings are an assessment, by each rating agency, of our ability to pay our obligations, including those under the Securities. Credit ratings are subject to revision, suspension or withdrawal at any time by the assigning rating organization in their sole discretion. Consequently, actual or anticipated changes to our credit ratings may affect the market value of the Securities. However, because the return on the Securities is dependent upon factors in addition to our ability to pay our obligations under the Securities, an improvement in our credit ratings will not necessarily increase the market value of the Securities and will not reduce market risk and other investment risks related to the Securities. Credit ratings do not address the price, if any, at which the Securities may be resold prior to maturity (which may be substantially less than the issue price of the Securities) and are not recommendations to buy, sell or hold the Securities. THE INCLUSION OF COMMISSIONS AND COST OF HEDGING IN THE ISSUE PRICE IS LIKELY TO ADVERSELY AFFECT SECONDARY MARKET PRICES.

Assuming no change in market conditions or any other relevant factors, the price, if any, at which the selling agents are willing to purchase Securities in secondary market transactions will likely be lower than the issue price, since the issue price included, and secondary market prices are likely to exclude, commissions paid with respect to the Securities, as well as the cost of hedging our obligations under the Securities. In addition, any such prices may differ from values determined by pricing models used by the selling agents, as a result of dealer discounts, mark-ups or other transaction costs.

THE SECURITIES WILL NOT BE LISTED ON ANY SECURITIES EXCHANGE; SECONDARY TRADING MAY BE LIMITED

You should be willing to hold your Securities until the maturity date. The Securities will not be listed on any securities exchange; accordingly, there may be little or no secondary market for the Securities and information regarding independent market pricing for the Securities may be very limited or non-existent. Even if there is a secondary market, it may not provide enough liquidity to allow you to trade or sell the Securities easily. Upon completion of the offering, our affiliate has informed us that it intends to purchase and sell the Securities from time to time in off-exchange transactions, but it is not required to do so. If our affiliate does make such a market in the

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Securities, it may stop doing so at any time.

In addition, if the total principal amount of the Securities being offered is not being purchased by investors in the offering, one or more of our affiliates has agreed to purchase the unsold portion. Such affiliate or affiliates intend to hold the Securities for investment purposes, which may affect the supply of Securities available for secondary trading and therefore adversely affect the price of the Securities in any secondary trading. If a substantial portion of any Securities held by our affiliates were to be offered for sale following this offering, the market price of such Securities could fall, especially if secondary trading in such Securities is limited or illiquid.

TAX TREATMENT

There is no direct legal authority as to the proper U.S. federal income tax characterization of the Securities, and we do not intend to request a ruling from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") or from the Dutch authorities regarding the Securities. No assurance can be given that the IRS will accept, or that a court will uphold, the characterization and tax treatment of the Securities described in the section of this Pricing Supplement entitled "Taxation." If the IRS were successful in asserting an alternative characterization for the Securities, the timing and character of income on the Securities could differ materially from our description herein. You should review carefully the section in this Pricing Supplement entitled "Taxation" and consult your tax advisor regarding your particular circumstances.

THE UNDERLYING FUND IS NOT ACTIVELY MANAGED

The Underlying Fund is not actively managed by traditional methods, and therefore the adverse financial condition of one or more issuers of stocks which comprise the S&P 500 Index(R) will not result in the elimination of such stock or stocks from the Underlying Fund unless such stock or stocks are removed from the S&P 500 Index(R). Because payment, if any, at maturity of the Securities is linked to the performance of the Underlying Fund, this may adversely affect the value of the Securities and the return, if any, on the Securities.

THE UNDERLYING FUND MAY NOT ALWAYS BE ABLE EXACTLY TO REPLICATE THE PERFORMANCE OF THE S&P 500 INDEX

It is possible that, for a short period, the Underlying Fund may not fully replicate the performance of the S&P 500 Index due to the temporary unavailability of certain Index Securities in the secondary market or due to other extraordinary circumstances. In addition, the Underlying Fund is not able to replicate exactly the performance of the S&P 500 Index because the S&P 500 Index is a theoretical calculation while the Underlying Fund is an actual portfolio of stocks. Accordingly, the total return generated by the Underlying Fund is reduced by its expenses and transaction costs incurred in adjusting the actual balance of the Underlying Fund. Because payment, if any, at maturity of the Securities is linked to the performance of the Underlying Fund, this may adversely affect the value of the Securities and the return, if any, on the Securities.

WE MAY ENGAGE IN BUSINESS WITH OR INVOLVING ONE OR MORE OF THE ISSUERS OF THE STOCKS THAT COMPRISE THE UNDERLYING FUND WITHOUT REGARD TO YOUR INTERESTS

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We or our affiliates may presently or from time to time engage in business with one or more of the issuers of the stocks comprising the Underlying Fund without regard to your interests, including extending loans to, or making equity investments in, providing investment advisory services to, one or more of such issuers or their affiliates or subsidiaries. In the course of our business, we or our affiliates may acquire non-public information about one or more of the issuers of the stocks comprising the Underlying Fund. None of us, Holding or any of our affiliates undertakes to disclose any such information to you. In addition, we or our affiliates from time to time have published, and in the future may publish, research reports with respect to the stocks. These research reports may or may not recommend that investors buy or hold the stocks comprising the Underlying Fund.

HEDGING AND TRADING ACTIVITIES BY US OR OUR AFFILIATES COULD AFFECT PRICES OF SECURITIES

We and our affiliates may carry out activities that minimize our risks related to the Securities. In particular, on or prior to the date of this Pricing Supplement, we, through our affiliates, hedged our anticipated exposure in connection with the Securities by taking positions in the stocks (or options or futures contracts on the stocks) that comprise the Underlying Fund, exchange-traded funds that track the S&P 500 Index, options or futures on the S&P 500 Index or the Underlying Fund or in other instruments that we deemed appropriate in connection with such hedging. Such hedging is carried out in a manner designed to minimize any impact on the closing price of the Underlying Fund. Our trading activities, however, could potentially have altered the price of the Underlying Fund and therefore affected the calculation of the payment at maturity. We or our affiliates are likely to modify our hedge position throughout the term of the Securities by purchasing and selling the stocks (or options or futures contracts on the stocks) that comprise the Underlying Fund, exchange-traded funds that track the S&P 500 Index, options or futures on the Underlying Fund or other instruments that we deem appropriate. Although we have no reason to believe that our hedging activity or other trading activities which we, or any of our affiliates, engage in or may engage in have had or will have a material impact on the price of the Underlying Fund, we cannot give any assurance that we have not or will not affect such price as a result of our hedging or trading activities. It is also possible that we or one of more of our affiliates could receive substantial returns from these hedging activities while the value of the Securities may decline.

We or one or more of our affiliates may also engage in trading the stocks (or options or futures contracts on the stocks) that comprise the Underlying Fund, exchange-traded funds that track the S&P 500 Index or options or futures on the Underlying Fund on a regular basis as part of our or their general broker-dealer activities and other businesses, for proprietary accounts, for other accounts under management or to facilitate transactions for customers, including through block transactions. Any of these activities could adversely affect the price of the Underlying Fund and, therefore, the value of the Securities.

We or one or more of our affiliates may also issue or underwrite other securities or financial or derivative instruments with returns linked or related to changes in the price of the Underlying Fund or stocks that comprise the Underlying Fund. By introducing competing products into the marketplace in this manner, we or one or more of our affiliates could adversely affect the value of the Securities.

POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST; NO SECURITY INTEREST IN SHARES OF THE UNDERLYING FUND HELD BY US

We and our affiliates may carry out hedging activities that minimize our risks related to the Securities, including trading in shares of the Underlying

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Fund. In particular, on or prior to the date of this Pricing Supplement, we, through our affiliates, hedged our anticipated exposure in connection with the Securities by taking positions in the Underlying Fund, futures or options contracts on Underlying Fund listed on major securities markets, and/or other instruments that we deemed appropriate in connection with such hedging. Our purchase activity, however, could potentially have increased the initial price of the Underlying Fund, and therefore increased the level below which we would deliver to you at maturity cash in an amount less than the principal amount of your Securities.

Through our affiliates, we are likely to modify our hedge position throughout the life of the Securities by purchasing and selling shares of the Underlying Fund, futures or options contracts on the Underlying Fund listed on major securities markets or positions in other securities or instruments that we may wish to use in connection with such hedging. We cannot give you any assurance that we have not or will not affect such price as a result of our

hedging or trading activities. Such hedging or trading activities during the term of the Securities could adversely affect whether the price of the Underlying Fund decreased below the 10% buffer and therefore whether or not you will receive less than the stated principal of the Securities at maturity. It is possible that we or one of more of our affiliates could receive substantial returns from these hedging activities while the value of the Securities may decline. We or one or more of our affiliates may also engage in trading shares of the Underlying Fund and other investments relating to the Underlying Fund on a regular basis as part of our or its general broker-dealer and other businesses, for proprietary accounts, for other accounts under management or to facilitate transactions for customers, including block transactions. Any of these activities could adversely affect the price of the Underlying Fund and, therefore, the value of the Securities. We or one or more of our affiliates may also issue or underwrite other securities or financial or derivative instruments with returns linked or related to changes in the price of the Underlying Fund. By introducing competing products into the marketplace in this manner, we or one or more of our affiliates could adversely affect the value of the Securities. It is also possible that any advisory services that we or our affiliates provide in the course of any business with the issuers of any of the stocks which comprise the Underlying Fund or their affiliates could lead to actions on the part of an issuer of any of the stocks that comprise the Underlying Fund which might adversely affect the price of the Underlying Fund.

The indenture governing the Securities does not contain any restrictions on our ability or the ability of any of our affiliates to sell, pledge or otherwise convey all or any portion of the shares of the Underlying Fund acquired by us or our affiliates. Neither we nor Holding nor any of our affiliates will pledge or otherwise hold shares of the Underlying Fund for the benefit of holders of the Securities in order to enable the holders to exchange their Securities for shares of the Underlying Fund under any circumstances. Consequently, in the event of a bankruptcy, insolvency or liquidation involving us or Holding, as the case may be, any shares of the Underlying Fund that we or Holding own will be subject to the claims of our creditors or Holding's creditors generally and will not be available specifically for the benefit of the holders of the Securities.

POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST BETWEEN SECURITY HOLDERS AND THE CALCULATION AGENT

As calculation agent, our affiliate AAI will calculate the payment due to

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you upon maturity of the Securities and may have to make additional calculations if the Underlying Fund is liquidated, suspended, modified, delisted or otherwise terminated. AAI and our other affiliates may carry out hedging activities related to the Securities, including trading in the stocks (or options or futures contracts on the stocks) that comprise the Underlying Fund, exchange-traded funds that track the S&P 500 Index, options or futures on the Underlying Fund or other instruments that it or they deem appropriate in connection with such hedging. AAI and some of our other affiliates also trade the stocks (and options and futures on stocks) that comprise the Underlying Fund, exchange-traded funds that track the S&P 500 Index, and options or futures on the Underlying Fund on a regular basis as part of its or their general broker dealer and other businesses. Any of these activities could influence AAI's determinations as calculation agent and any such trading activity could potentially affect the price of the Underlying Fund and, accordingly, could affect the payout on the Securities at maturity. As such, potential conflicts of interest may exist between AAI or its affiliates and you.

RECENT U.S. TAX LAW DEVELOPMENTS

On December 7, 2007, the U.S. Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service released a notice requesting comments on the U.S. federal income tax treatment of "prepaid forward contracts" and similar instruments.

The notice focuses in particular on whether to require holders of instruments such as the Securities to accrue constructive income over the term of their investment in the Securities. It also asks for comments on a number of related topics, including how the IRS characterizes income or loss with respect to these instruments; the relevance to such characterization of factors such as the exchange-traded status of the instrument and the nature of the underlying property to which the instrument is linked; and whether these instruments are or should be subject to the "constructive ownership" regime, which very generally can operate to recharacterize certain long-term capital gains as ordinary income that is subject to an interest charge.

While the notice requests comments on appropriate transition rules and effective dates, Treasury regulations or other forms of guidance, if any, issued after consideration of these issues could materially and adversely affect the tax consequences of ownership and disposition of the Securities, possibly on a retroactive basis.

HOLDINGS OF THE SECURITIES BY OUR AFFILIATES AND FUTURE SALES

Certain of our affiliates have agreed to purchase for investment the portion of the Securities that has not been purchased by investors in this offering, which initially they intend to hold for investment purposes. As a result, upon completion of this offering, our affiliates may own a substantial portion of the aggregate principal amount of the offering of Securities. Circumstances may occur in which our interests or those of our affiliates could be in conflict with your interests. For example, our affiliates may attempt to sell the Securities that they had been holding for investment purposes at the same time that you attempt to sell your Securities, which could depress the price, if any, at which you can sell your Securities. Moreover, the liquidity of the market for the Securities, if any, could be substantially reduced as a

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result of our affiliates holding the Securities. See "--The Securities Will Not be Listed on any Securities Exchange; Secondary Trading May Be Limited." In addition, our affiliates could have substantial influence over any matter subject to consent of the security holders.

HYPOTHETICAL RETURN ANALYSIS OF THE SECURITIES AT MATURITY

In this hypothetical example, the fund return on the Underlying Fund would be calculated as:

$$\frac{65.00 - 90.00}{90.00} = -27.78\%$$

In this hypothetical example, the fund return is less than -10%. Therefore, the payment at maturity will be calculated as:

$$\$1,000 \text{ plus } [(\text{fund return} + 10\%) \times 1.1111 \times \$1,000]$$

or

$$\$1,000 + [(-27.78\% + 10\%) \times 1.1111 \times \$1,000] = \$802.45$$

In this hypothetical example, because the fund return was below -10%, at maturity you would receive less than \$1,000 for each \$1,000 principal amount of Security. YOU COULD LOSE UP TO 100% OF YOUR INITIAL INVESTMENT IF THE FUND RETURN IS BELOW -10%. In this hypothetical example, the fund return was -27.78% but you would have lost 19.76% of your initial principal investment over the term of the Securities.

Hypothetical Final Price: \$83.00

In this hypothetical example, the fund return would be calculated as:

$$\frac{83.00 - 90.00}{90.00} = -7.78\%$$

In this hypothetical example, the fund return is between zero and -10%. Therefore, the payment at maturity for each \$1,000 principal amount of Securities will be \$1,000. In this hypothetical example, your return on your initial principal investment was zero. YOU WILL NOT BE COMPENSATED FOR ANY LOSS IN VALUE DUE TO INFLATION AND OTHER FACTORS RELATING TO THE VALUE OF MONEY OVER TIME.

EXAMPLE 3:

Hypothetical Initial Price: \$90.00

Hypothetical Final Price: \$120.00

In this hypothetical example, the fund return would be calculated as:

$$\frac{120.00 - 90.00}{90.00} = 22.22\%$$

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In this hypothetical example, the fund return is positive. Accordingly, the payment at maturity will be equal to the sum of \$1,000 plus the out performance amount.

The out-performance amount is the lesser of (a) the participation rate x the fund return x \$1,000 and (b) the maximum amount.

or

$400\% \times 22.22\% \times \$1,000 = \$888.89$ and (ii) \$250.00

Therefore, in this hypothetical example, the out performance amount will be \$250 since \$250 is less than \$888.89. As a result, you would receive at maturity the principal amount of \$1,000 plus \$250.00, for a total payment

GENERAL

The S&P 500 Index(R) is published by S&P and is intended to provide an indication of the pattern of common stock price movement. It is a market-value weighted index (stock price times number of shares outstanding), with each stock's weight in the index proportionate to its market value. The calculation of the value of the S&P 500 Index, discussed below in further detail, is based on the relative value of the aggregate market value of the common stocks of 500 companies as of a particular time compared to the aggregate average market value of the common stocks of 500 similar companies during the base period of the years 1941 through 1943.

S&P chooses companies for inclusion in the S&P 500 Index(R) with the aim of achieving a distribution across broad industry groupings that approximates the actual distribution of these groupings in the common stock population of the Standard & Poor's Stock Guide Database of over 10,000 companies, which S&P uses as an assumed model for the composition of the total market. Relevant criteria employed by S&P include the viability of the particular company, the extent to which that company represents the industry group to which it is assigned, the extent to which the market price of the company's common stock is generally responsive to changes in the affairs of the respective industry and the market value and trading activity of the common stock of that company. S&P may from time to time, in its sole discretion, add companies to, or delete companies from, the S&P 500 Index(R) to achieve the objectives stated above.

COMPUTATION OF THE S&P 500 INDEX(R)

S&P currently computes the S&P 500 Index as of any particular time as follows:

1. the product of the market price per share and the number of then outstanding shares of each component stock is determined as of such time (such product referred to as the "market value" of such stock);
2. the market values of all component stocks as of such time are aggregated;
3. the mean average of the market values as of each week in the "base period" of the years 1941 through 1943 of the common stock of each company in a group of 500 substantially similar companies is determined;
4. the mean average market values of all such common stocks over such base period are aggregated (such aggregate amount being referred to herein as the "base value");
5. the aggregate market value of all component stocks (as determined under clause (2) above) is divided by the base value; and
6. the resulting quotient (expressed in decimals) is multiplied by ten.

While S&P currently employs the above methodology to calculate the S&P 500 Index(R), no assurance can be given that S&P will not modify or change such methodology in a manner that may affect the amounts payable on the Securities at maturity or influence our decision to call the Securities.

S&P adjusts the foregoing formula to negate the effects of changes in the market value of a component stock that it determines to be arbitrary or not due to true market fluctuations. Such changes may result from such causes

as the issuance of stock dividends, the granting to shareholders of rights to purchase additional shares of such stock, the purchase of shares by employees pursuant to employee benefit plans, certain consolidations and acquisitions, the granting to shareholders of rights to purchase other securities of the company, the substitution by S&P of particular component stocks in the S&P 500 Index(R), and other reasons. In all such cases, S&P first recalculates the aggregate market value of all component stocks (after taking account of the new market price per share of the particular component stock or the new number of outstanding shares thereof or both, as the case may be) and then determines the new base value in accordance with the following formula:

$$\text{old base value} \times \frac{\text{new market value}}{\text{old market value}} = \text{new base value}$$

The result is that the base value is adjusted in proportion to any change in the aggregate market value of all component stocks resulting from the causes referred to above to the extent necessary to negate the effects of such causes upon the S&P 500 Index(R).

Upon any selection by the Calculation Agent of a Successor Fund, the Calculation Agent will cause written notice thereof to be furnished to us, the Trustee, the Securities Administrator and the Depository Trust Company as the holder of the Securities within three Trading Days of such selection.

If the Fund Sponsor liquidates, delists or otherwise terminates the Underlying Fund prior to, and such liquidation, delisting or termination is continuing on, the Determination Date, and AAI as the Calculation Agent determines that no Successor Fund is available with respect to the Underlying Fund at such time, then the Calculation Agent will determine the Final Price with respect to the Underlying Fund. USE OF PROCEEDS

The net proceeds we receive from the sale of the Securities will be used for general corporate purposes and by us or one or more of our affiliates in connection with hedging our obligations under the Securities, including hedging market risks associated with the payment at maturity of the Securities. The issue price of the Securities includes the selling agents' commissions (as shown on the cover page of the accompanying Prospectus Supplement) paid with respect to the Securities and the cost of hedging our obligations under the Securities. The cost of hedging includes the projected profit that our affiliates expect to realize in consideration for assuming the risks inherent in managing the hedging transactions. Since hedging our obligations entails risk and may be influenced by market forces beyond our or our affiliates'

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control, such hedging may result in a profit that is more or less than initially projected, or could result in a loss. TAXATION

The following summary is a general description of certain United States and Dutch tax considerations relating to the ownership and disposition of Securities. It does not purport to be a complete analysis of all tax considerations relating to the Securities. Prospective purchasers of Securities should consult their tax advisors as to the consequences of acquiring, holding and disposing of Securities under the tax laws of the country of which they are resident for tax purposes as well as under the laws of any state, local or foreign jurisdiction. This summary is based upon the law as in effect on the date of this Pricing Supplement and is subject to any change in law that may take effect after such date.

UNITED STATES FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION

The following discussion is based on the advice of Clifford Chance US LLP, our special tax counsel ("Tax Counsel"), and describes the principal U.S. federal income tax consequences to holders who purchase the Securities at initial issuance for the stated principal amount and who will hold the Securities as capital assets within the meaning of Section 1221 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

This discussion does not describe all of the tax consequences that may be relevant in light of a holder's particular circumstances or to holders subject to special rules, such as certain financial institutions, insurance companies, dealers in commodities, securities or foreign currencies, persons holding Securities as part of a hedging transaction, "straddle," conversion transaction or other integrated transaction, U.S. Holders (as defined below) whose functional currency is not the U.S. dollar, regulated investment companies, real estate investment trusts, tax exempt organizations, or partnerships or other entities classified as partnerships for U.S. federal income tax purposes.

This discussion is based on the Code, administrative pronouncements, judicial decisions and final, temporary and proposed Treasury Regulations, changes to any of which subsequent to the date of this Pricing Supplement may affect the tax consequences described below, possibly with retroactive effect. PERSONS CONSIDERING THE PURCHASE OF THE SECURITIES SHOULD CONSULT THEIR TAX ADVISORS WITH REGARD TO THE APPLICATION OF THE U.S. FEDERAL INCOME TAX LAWS TO THEIR PARTICULAR SITUATIONS AS WELL AS ANY TAX CONSEQUENCES ARISING UNDER THE LAWS OF ANY STATE, LOCAL OR FOREIGN TAXING JURISDICTION.

As used herein, you are a "U.S. Holder" if you are the beneficial owner of a Security and are, for U.S. federal income tax purposes:

- o a citizen or individual resident of the United States;
- o a corporation created or organized in or under the laws of the United States or of any political subdivision thereof, or
- o an estate or trust the income of which is subject to U.S. federal income taxation regardless of its source.

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The term "U.S. Holder" also includes certain former citizens and residents of the United States.

If a partnership invests in Securities, the tax treatment of the partner will generally depend on the status of the partner and the activities of the partnership. Partners in a partnership that invests in Securities are urged to consult with their tax advisors about the consequences of the investment.

GENERAL

Pursuant to the terms of the Securities, we and every holder of a Security agree (in the absence of an administrative determination or judicial ruling to the contrary) to characterize each Security for all U.S. tax purposes as a single financial contract with respect to the Underlying Fund that (i) requires the investor to pay us at inception an amount equal to the purchase price of the Security and (ii) entitles the investor to receive at maturity an amount in cash based upon the performance of the Underlying Fund and the terms of the Securities (including the Participation Rate and the Maximum Amount). While other characterizations of the Securities could be asserted by the IRS, as discussed below, the following discussion assumes that this characterization of the Securities will be respected. In particular, you should review the discussion under "Possible Alternative Tax Treatments of an Investment in the Securities" and "Recent U.S. Tax Developments" below. In the opinion of Tax Counsel, which is based on certain representations received from us, the purchase and ownership of a Security should be treated as an "open transaction" with respect to the Underlying Fund for U.S. federal income tax purposes.

TAX CONSEQUENCES TO U.S. HOLDERS

Assuming the characterization of the Securities described above, the following U.S. federal income tax consequences should result to you if you are a U.S. Holder.

TAX TREATMENT PRIOR TO MATURITY. You should not be required to recognize taxable income over the term of the Securities prior to maturity, other than pursuant to a sale or exchange as described below.

TAX BASIS. Your tax basis in a Security will equal the amount paid by you to acquire the Security.

SETTLEMENT OF A SECURITY AT MATURITY. Upon receipt of cash at maturity, you generally will recognize short-term capital gain or loss equal to the difference between the amount of cash received and your tax basis in the Security.

SALE OR EXCHANGE OF A SECURITY. Upon a sale or exchange of a Security prior to maturity, you will recognize short-term capital gain or loss equal to the difference between the amount realized on the sale or exchange and your tax basis in the Security sold or exchanged.

POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVE TAX TREATMENTS OF AN INVESTMENT IN THE SECURITIES

Due to the absence of authorities that directly address the proper tax treatment of the Securities, no assurance can be given that the IRS will accept, or that a court will uphold, the characterization and treatment described above. A successful assertion of an alternative characterization of the Securities by the IRS could affect the timing and the character of any income or loss with respect to the Securities. It is possible, for instance, that the entire coupon on the Securities could be treated as giving rise to ordinary income.

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Accordingly, you are urged to consult your own tax advisors regarding the possible consequences of alternative characterizations of the Securities.

RECENT U.S. TAX LAW DEVELOPMENTS

On December 7, 2007, the U.S. Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service released a notice requesting comments on the U.S. federal income tax treatment of "prepaid forward contracts" and similar instruments.

The notice focuses in particular on whether to require holders of instruments such as the Securities to accrue constructive income over the term of their investment in the Securities. It also asks for comments on a number of related topics, including how the IRS characterizes income or loss with respect to these instruments; the relevance to such characterization of factors such as the exchange-traded status of the instrument and the nature of the underlying property to which the instrument is linked; and whether these instruments are or should be subject to the "constructive ownership" regime, which very generally can operate to recharacterize certain long-term capital gains as ordinary income that is subject to an interest charge.

While the notice requests comments on appropriate transition rules and effective dates, Treasury regulations or other forms of guidance, if any, issued after consideration of these issues could materially and adversely affect the tax consequences of ownership and disposition of the Securities, possibly on a retroactive basis.

Investors should consult their own tax advisor regarding the notice and its potential implications for an investment in the Securities.

BACKUP WITHHOLDING AND INFORMATION REPORTING

Information returns may be filed with the Internal Revenue Service in connection with payments on the Securities and the proceeds from a sale or other disposition of the Securities. You may be subject to U.S. backup withholding on these payments if you fail to provide your tax identification number to the paying agent and comply with certain certification procedures or otherwise establish an exemption from backup withholding. The amount of any backup withholding from a payment to you will be allowed as a credit against your U.S. federal income tax liability and may entitle you to a refund, provided that the required information is furnished to the Internal Revenue Service.

TAX TREATMENT OF THE SECURITIES TO NON-U.S. HOLDERS

If you are not a U.S. Holder, you will not be subject to U.S. withholding tax with respect to payments on your Securities but you may be subject to generally applicable information reporting and backup withholding requirements with respect to payments on your Securities unless you comply with certain certification and identification requirements as to your foreign status or an exception to the information reporting and backup withholding rules otherwise applies.

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PLAN OF DISTRIBUTION

We have appointed ABN AMRO Incorporated ("AAI") as agent for this offering. AAI has agreed to use reasonable efforts to solicit offers to purchase the Securities. We will pay AAI, in connection with sales of the Securities resulting from a solicitation such agent made or an offer to purchase such agent received, a commission of 1.75% of the initial offering price of the Securities. AAI has informed us that, as part of its distribution of the Securities, it intends to reoffer the Securities to other dealers who will sell the Securities. Each such dealer engaged by AAI, or further engaged by a dealer to whom AAI reoffers the Securities, will purchase the Securities at an agreed discount to the initial offering price of the Securities. AAI has informed us that such discounts may vary from dealer to dealer and that not all dealers will purchase or repurchase the Securities at the same discount. You can find a general description of the commission rates payable to the agents under "Plan of Distribution" in the accompanying Prospectus Supplement.

AAI is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank. AAI will conduct this offering in compliance with the requirements of NASD Rule 2720, regarding a Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. member firm's distributing the securities of an affiliate. The Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, Inc. (commonly referred to as FINRA) is the successor to the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. When the distribution of the Securities is complete, AAI may offer and sell those Securities in the course of its business as a broker-dealer. AAI may act as principal or agent in those transactions and will make any sales at prevailing secondary market prices at the time of sale. THE PRICING SUPPLEMENT WILL ADD SPECIFIC TERMS FOR EACH ISSUANCE OF NOTES AND MAY MODIFY OR REPLACE ANY OF THE INFORMATION IN THIS SECTION AND IN "DESCRIPTION OF DEBT SECURITIES" IN THE ACCOMPANYING PROSPECTUS.

GENERAL TERMS OF NOTES

We may issue notes under an indenture dated September 15, 2006, among us, Wilmington Trust Company, as trustee, Citibank, N.A., as securities administrator and Holding, as guarantor, which we refer to as the "Indenture." The notes issued under the Indenture will constitute a single series under the Indenture, together with any notes that we issue in the future under the Indenture that we designate as being part of that series.

OUTSTANDING INDEBTEDNESS OF THE BANK. The Indenture does not limit the amount of additional indebtedness that we may incur.

RANKING. Notes issued under the Indenture will constitute unsecured and unsubordinated obligations of the Bank and rank pari passu without any preference among them and with all other present and future unsecured and unsubordinated obligations of the Bank save for those preferred by mandatory provision of law.

TERMS SPECIFIED IN PRICING SUPPLEMENTS. A pricing supplement will specify the following terms of any issuance of our notes to the extent applicable:

- o the specific designation of the notes;
- o the issue price (price to public);
- o the aggregate principal amount;
- o the denominations or minimum denominations;
- o the original issue date;

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- o the stated maturity date and any terms related to any extension of the maturity date;
- o whether the notes are fixed rate notes, floating rate notes or notes with original issue discount;
- o for fixed rate notes, the rate per year at which the notes will bear interest, if any, or the method of calculating that rate and the dates on which interest will be payable;
- o for floating rate notes, the base rate, the index maturity, the spread, the spread multiplier, the initial interest rate, the interest reset periods, the interest payment dates, the maximum interest rate, the minimum interest rate and any other terms relating to the particular method of calculating the interest rate for the note;
- o whether interest, if any, will be payable in cash or payable in kind;
- o whether the notes may be redeemed, in whole or in part, at our option or repaid at your option, prior to the stated maturity date, and the terms of any redemption or repayment;
- o whether the notes are currency-linked notes and/or notes linked to commodity prices, securities of entities not affiliated with us, any other financial, economic or other measures or instruments, including the occurrence or non-occurrence of any event or circumstance, and/or baskets or indices of any of these items, or any combination of the above;

- o the terms on which holders of the notes may convert or exchange them into or for stock or other securities of entities not affiliated with us, or for the cash value of any of these securities or for any other property, any specific terms relating to the adjustment of the conversion or exchange feature and the period during which the holders may effect the conversion or exchange;
- o whether the notes are renewable notes;
- o if any note is not denominated and payable in U.S. dollars, the currency or currencies in which the principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, will be paid, which we refer to as the "specified currency," along with any other terms relating to the non-U.S. dollar denomination, including exchange rates as against the U.S. dollar at selected times during the last five years and any exchange controls affecting that specified currency;
- o whether and under what circumstances we will pay additional amounts on the notes for any tax, assessment or governmental charge withheld or deducted and, if so, whether we will have the option to redeem those debt securities rather than pay the additional amounts;
- o whether the notes will be listed on any stock exchange;
- o whether the notes will be issued in book-entry or certificated form;
- o if the notes are in book-entry form, whether the notes will be offered on a global basis to investors through Euroclear and Clearstream

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Banking, SOCIETE ANONYME as well as through the Depositary (each as defined below); and

- o any other terms on which we will issue the notes.

SOME DEFINITIONS. We have defined some of the terms that we use frequently in this prospectus supplement below:

A "business day" means any day, other than a Saturday or Sunday, (a) that is neither a legal holiday nor a day on which banking institutions are authorized or required by law or regulation to close (x) for all notes, in The City of New York, (y) for notes denominated in a specified currency other than U.S. dollars, euro or Australian dollars, in the principal financial center of the country of the specified currency or (z) for notes denominated in Australian dollars, in Sydney; and (b) for notes denominated in euro, that is also a TARGET Settlement Day.

"Depositary" means The Depositary Trust Company, New York, New York.

"Euro LIBOR notes" means LIBOR notes for which the index currency is euros.

An "interest payment date" for any note means a date on which, under the terms of that note, regularly scheduled interest is payable.

"London banking day" means any day on which dealings in deposits in the relevant index currency are transacted in the London interbank market.

The "record date" for any interest payment date is the date 15 calendar days prior to that interest payment date, whether or not that date is a business day, unless another date is specified in the applicable pricing supplement.

"TARGET Settlement Day" means any day on which the Trans-European Automated Real-time Gross Settlement Express Transfer System ("TARGET") is open.

References in this prospectus supplement to "U.S. dollar," or "U.S.\$" or "\$" are to the currency of the United States of America.

GUARANTEE

Holding will fully and unconditionally guarantee payment in full to the holders of the notes issued by the Bank under the Indenture after the date hereof. The guarantee is set forth in, and forms a part of, the Indenture under which the notes will be issued. If, for any reason, the Bank does not make any required payment in respect of the notes when due, Holding as the guarantor thereof will cause the payment to be made to or to the order of the trustee. The holder of the guaranteed note may sue the guarantor to enforce its rights under the guarantee without first suing the Bank or any other person or entity. The guarantees will constitute Holding's unsecured and unsubordinated obligations and rank pari passu without any preference among them and with all Holding's other present and future unsecured and unsubordinated obligations.

FORMS OF NOTES

We will offer the notes on a continuing basis and will issue notes only in fully registered form either as registered global notes or as certificated notes. References to "holders" mean those who own notes registered in their own names, on the books that we or the trustee maintain for this purpose, and not

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those who own beneficial interests in notes registered in street name or in notes issued in book-entry form through one or more depositaries.

REGISTERED GLOBAL NOTES. For registered global notes, we will issue one or more global certificates representing the entire issue of notes. Except as set forth in the accompanying prospectus under "Forms of Securities -- Global Securities," you may not exchange registered global notes or interests in registered global notes for certificated notes.

Each global note certificate representing registered global notes will be deposited with, or on behalf of, the Depositary and registered in the name of a nominee of the Depositary. These certificates name the Depositary or its nominee as the owner of the notes. The Depositary maintains a computerized system that will reflect the interests held by its participants in the global notes. An investor's beneficial interest will be reflected in the records of the Depositary's direct or indirect participants through an account maintained by the investor with its broker/dealer, bank, trust company or other representative. A further description of the Depositary's procedures for global notes representing book-entry notes is set forth under "Forms of Securities -- The Depositary" in the accompanying prospectus. The Depositary has confirmed to us, AAI, LFS and the trustee that it intends to follow these procedures.

CERTIFICATED NOTES. If we issue notes in certificated form, the certificate will name the investor or the investor's nominee as the owner of the note. The person named in the note register will be considered the owner of the note for all purposes under the Indenture. For example, if we need to ask the holders of the notes to vote on a proposed amendment to the notes, the person named in the note register will be asked to cast any vote regarding that note. If you have chosen to have some other entity hold the certificates for you, that entity will be considered the owner of your note in our records and will be entitled to cast the vote regarding your note. You may not exchange certificated notes for registered global notes or interests in registered global notes.

DENOMINATIONS. Unless otherwise specified in the pricing supplement, we will issue the notes:

- o for U.S. dollar-denominated notes, in denominations of \$100 or any amount greater than \$100 that is an integral multiple of \$100; or
- o for notes denominated in a specified currency other than U.S. dollars, in denominations of the equivalent of \$100, rounded to an integral multiple of 100 units of the specified currency, or any larger integral multiple of 100 units of the specified currency, as determined by reference to the market exchange rate, as defined under "-- Interest and Principal Payments -- Unavailability of Foreign Currency" below, on the business day immediately preceding the date of issuance.

INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL PAYMENTS

PAYMENTS, EXCHANGES AND TRANSFERS. Holders may present notes for payment of principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, register the transfer of the notes, and exchange the notes at Citibank, N.A, the securities administrator under the Indenture, at 111 Wall Street, 15th Floor, New York, New York 10043, Attention: Agency

and Trust Group, as our current agent for the payment, transfer and exchange of the notes. We refer to Citibank, acting in this capacity, as the paying agent.

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However, holders of global notes may transfer and exchange global notes only in the manner and to the extent set forth under "Forms of Securities -- Global Securities" in the accompanying prospectus.

We will not be required to:

- o register the transfer or exchange of any note if the holder has exercised the holder's right, if any, to require us to repurchase the note, in whole or in part, except the portion of the note not required to be repurchased;
- o register the transfer or exchange of notes to be redeemed for a period of fifteen calendar days preceding the mailing of the relevant notice of redemption; or
- o register the transfer or exchange of any note selected for redemption in whole or in part, except the unredeemed or unpaid portion of that note being redeemed in part.

No service charge will be made for any registration or transfer or exchange of notes, but we may require payment of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge payable in connection with the registration of transfer or exchange of notes.

Although we anticipate making payments of principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, on most notes in U.S. dollars, some notes may be payable in foreign currencies as specified in the applicable pricing supplement. Currently, few facilities exist in the United States to convert U.S. dollars into foreign currencies and vice versa. In addition, most U.S. banks do not offer non-U.S. dollar denominated checking or savings account facilities. Accordingly, unless alternative arrangements are made, we will pay principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, on notes that are payable in a foreign currency to an account at a bank outside the United States, which, in the case of a note payable in euro, will be made by credit or transfer to a euro account specified by the payee in a country for which the euro is the lawful currency.

RECIPIENTS OF PAYMENTS. The paying agent will pay interest to the person in whose name the note is registered at the close of business on the applicable record date. We expect that the Depository, upon receipt of any payment, will immediately credit its participants' accounts in amounts proportionate to their respective beneficial interests in the book-entry notes as shown on the records of the Depository. We also expect that payments by the Depository's participants to owners of beneficial interests in the book-entry notes will be governed by standing customer instructions and customary practices and will be the responsibility of those participants.

CERTIFICATED NOTES. Except as indicated below, for payments of interest at maturity, redemption or repayment, the paying agent will make U.S. dollar

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payments of interest either:

- o by check mailed to the address of the person entitled to payment as shown on the note register; or
- o by wire transfer of immediately available funds, if the holder has provided wire transfer instructions to the paying agent not later than 15 calendar days prior to the applicable interest payment date.

U.S. dollar payments of principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, upon maturity, redemption or repayment on a note will be made in immediately available funds against presentation and surrender of the note.

PAYMENT PROCEDURES FOR BOOK-ENTRY NOTES DENOMINATED IN A FOREIGN CURRENCY. Book-entry notes payable in a specified currency other than U.S. dollars will provide that a beneficial owner of interests in those notes may elect to receive all or a portion of the payments of principal, premium, if any, or interest, if any, in U.S. dollars. In those cases, the Depository will elect to receive all payments with respect to the beneficial owner's interest in the notes in U.S. Dollars, unless the beneficial owner takes the following steps:

- o The beneficial owner must give complete instructions to the direct or indirect participant through which it holds the book-entry notes of its election to receive those payments in the specified currency other than U.S. dollars by wire transfer to an account specified by the beneficial owner with a bank located outside the United States. In the case of a note payable in euro, the account must be a euro account in a country for which the euro is the lawful currency.
- o The participant must notify the Depository of the beneficial owner's election on or prior to the third business day after the applicable record date, for payments of interest, and on or prior to the twelfth business day prior to the maturity date or any redemption or repayment date, for payment of principal or premium.
- o The Depository must have notified the paying agent of the beneficial owner's election on or prior to the fifth business day after the applicable record date, for payments of interest, and on or prior to the tenth business day prior to the maturity date or any redemption or repayment date, for payment of principal or premium.

Beneficial owners should consult their participants in order to ascertain the deadline for giving instructions to participants in order to ensure that timely notice will be delivered to the Depository.

PAYMENT PROCEDURES FOR CERTIFICATED NOTES DENOMINATED IN A FOREIGN CURRENCY. For certificated notes payable in a specified currency other than U.S. dollars, the notes may provide that the holder may elect to receive all or a portion of the payments on those notes in U.S. dollars. To do so, the holder must send a written request to the paying agent:

- o for payments of interest, on or prior to the fifth business day after the applicable record date; or
- o for payments of principal, at least ten business days prior to the maturity date or any redemption or repayment date.

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To revoke this election for all or a portion of the payments on the certificated notes, the holder must send written notice to the paying agent:

- o at least five business days prior to the applicable record date, for payment of interest; or
- o at least ten business days prior to the maturity date or any redemption or repayment date, for payments of principal.

If the holder elects to be paid in a currency other than U.S. dollars, the paying agent will pay the principal, premium, if any, or interest, if any, on the certificated notes:

- o by wire transfer of immediately available funds in the specified currency to the holder's account at a bank located outside the United States, and in the case of a note payable in euro, in a country for which the euro is the lawful currency, if the paying agent has received the holder's written wire transfer instructions not less than 15 calendar days prior to the applicable payment date; or
- o by check payable in the specified currency mailed to the address of the person entitled to payment that is specified in the note register, if the holder has not provided wire instructions.

However, the paying agent will pay only the principal of the certificated notes, any premium and interest, if any, due at maturity, or on any redemption or repayment date, upon surrender of the certificated notes at the office or agency of the paying agent.

DETERMINATION OF EXCHANGE RATE FOR PAYMENTS IN U.S. DOLLARS FOR NOTES DENOMINATED IN A FOREIGN CURRENCY. The exchange rate agent identified in the relevant pricing supplement will convert the specified currency into U.S. dollars for holders who elect to receive payments in U.S. dollars and for beneficial owners of book-entry notes that do not follow the procedures we have described immediately above. The conversion will be based on the highest bid quotation in The City of New York received by the exchange rate agent at approximately 11:00 a.m., New York City time, on the second business day preceding the applicable payment date from three recognized foreign exchange dealers for the purchase by the quoting dealer:

- o of the specified currency for U.S. dollars for settlement on the payment date;
- o in the aggregate amount of the specified currency payable to those holders or beneficial owners of notes; and
- o at which the applicable dealer commits to execute a contract.

One of the dealers providing quotations may be the exchange rate agent unless the exchange rate agent is an affiliate of the Bank. If those bid quotations are not available, payments will be made in the specified currency. The holders or beneficial owners of notes will pay all currency exchange costs by deductions from the amounts payable on the notes.

UNAVAILABILITY OF FOREIGN CURRENCY. The relevant specified currency may not be available to us or Holding, as the case may be, for making payments of principal of, premium on, if any, or interest, if any, on any note. This could

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occur due to the imposition of exchange controls or other circumstances beyond our control or if the specified currency is no longer used by the government of the country issuing that currency or by public institutions within the international banking community for the settlement of transactions. If the specified currency is unavailable, we may satisfy our obligations to holders of the notes by making those payments on the date of payment in U.S. dollars on the basis of the noon dollar buying rate in The City of New York for cable transfers of the currency or currencies in which a payment on any note was to be made, published by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, which we refer to as the "market exchange rate." If that rate of exchange is not then available or is not published for a particular payment currency, the market exchange rate will be based on the highest bid quotation in The City of New York received by the exchange rate agent at approximately 11:00 a.m., New York City time, on the second business day preceding the applicable payment date from three recognized foreign exchange dealers for the purchase by the quoting dealer:

- o of the specified currency for U.S. dollars for settlement on the payment date;
- o in the aggregate amount of the specified currency payable to those holders or beneficial owners of notes; and
- o at which the applicable dealer commits to execute a contract.

One of the dealers providing quotations may be the exchange rate agent unless the exchange rate agent is our affiliate. If those bid quotations are not available, the exchange rate agent will determine the market exchange rate at its sole discretion.

These provisions do not apply if a specified currency is unavailable because it has been replaced by the euro. If the euro has been substituted for a specified currency, we may at our option, or will, if required by applicable law, without the consent of the holders of the affected notes, pay the principal of, premium on, if any, or interest, if any, on any note denominated in the specified currency in euro instead of the specified currency, in conformity with legally applicable measures taken pursuant to, or by virtue of, the treaty establishing the European Community, as amended by the treaty on European Union. Any payment made in U.S. dollars or in euro as described above where the required payment is in an unavailable specified currency will not constitute an event of default.

DISCOUNT NOTES. Some notes may be issued at a price which represents a discount to their principal amount. We refer to these notes as "discount notes." Such discount may be required to be included in income for U.S. federal income tax purposes, as described under "United States Federal Taxation -- Original Issue Discount." In the event of a redemption or repayment of any discount note or if any discount note is declared to be due and payable

immediately as described under "Description of Debt Securities -- Events of Default" in the accompanying prospectus, the amount of principal due and payable on that note will be limited to:

- o the aggregate principal amount of the note MULTIPLIED BY the sum of
- o its issue price, expressed as a percentage of the aggregate principal amount, PLUS

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- o the original issue discount accrued from the date of issue to the date of redemption, repayment or declaration, expressed as a percentage of the aggregate principal amount.

Solely for purposes of determining the amount of original issue discount that has accrued under the above formula as of any date on which a redemption, repayment or acceleration of maturity occurs for a discount note, original issue discount will be accrued using a constant yield method. The constant yield will be calculated using a 30-day month, 360-day year convention, a compounding period that, except for the initial period (as defined below), corresponds to the shortest period between interest payment dates for the applicable discount note (with ratable accruals within a compounding period), and an assumption that the maturity of a discount note will not be accelerated. If the period from the date of issue to the first interest payment date for a discount note, which we refer to as the "initial period", is shorter than the compounding period for the discount note, a proportionate amount of the yield for an entire compounding period will be accrued. If the initial period is longer than the compounding period, then the period will be divided into a regular compounding period and a short period with the short period being treated as provided in the preceding sentence.

The accrual of the applicable original issue discount described above is solely for purposes of determining the amounts payable upon redemption, repayment or acceleration of maturity. That amount of accrued original issue discount may differ from the accrual of original issue discount for purposes of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"). Certain discount notes may not be treated as having original issue discount within the meaning of the Code, and notes other than discount notes may be treated as issued with original issue discount for federal income tax purposes. See "United States Federal Taxation--Original Issue Discount" below. See also the applicable pricing supplement for any special considerations applicable to these notes.

FIXED RATE NOTES

Each fixed rate note will bear interest from the date of issuance at the annual rate stated on its face until the principal is paid or made available for payment.

HOW INTEREST IS CALCULATED. Interest on fixed rate notes will be computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months.

HOW INTEREST ACCRUES. Interest on fixed rate notes will accrue from and including the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, or, if no interest has been paid or duly provided for, from and including the issue date or any other date specified in a pricing supplement on which interest begins to accrue. Interest will accrue to but excluding the next interest payment date, or, if earlier, the date on which the principal has been paid or duly made available for payment, except as described below under "If a Payment Date Is not a Business Day."

WHEN INTEREST IS PAID. Payments of interest on fixed rate notes will be made on the interest payment dates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. However, if the first interest payment date is less than 15 days after the date of issuance, interest will not be paid on the first interest payment date, but will be paid on the second interest payment date.

AMOUNT OF INTEREST PAYABLE. Interest payments for fixed rate notes will include accrued interest from and including the date of issue or from and including the last date in respect of which interest has been paid, as the case may be, to but excluding the relevant interest payment date or date of maturity or earlier redemption or repayment, as the case may be.

IF A PAYMENT DATE IS NOT A BUSINESS DAY. If any scheduled interest payment date is not a business day, we will pay interest on the next business day, but interest on that payment will not accrue during the period from and after the scheduled interest payment date. If the scheduled maturity date or date of redemption or repayment is not a business day, we may pay interest and principal and premium, if any, on the next succeeding business day, but interest on that payment will not accrue during the period from and after the scheduled maturity date or date of redemption or repayment.

FLOATING RATE NOTES

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, each floating rate note will bear interest at a floating rate determined by reference to an interest rate or interest rate formula, which we refer to as the "base rate." The base rate may be one or more of the following:

- o the CD rate,
- o the commercial paper rate,
- o EURIBOR,
- o the federal funds rate,
- o LIBOR,
- o the prime rate,
- o the Treasury rate,
- o the CPI, or
- o any other rate or interest rate formula specified in the applicable pricing supplement.

FORMULA FOR INTEREST RATES. The interest rate on each floating rate note will be calculated by reference to:

- o the specified base rate based on the index maturity,
- o plus or minus the spread, if any, and/or
- o multiplied by the spread multiplier, if any.

For any floating rate note, "index maturity" means the period of maturity of the instrument or obligation from which the base rate is calculated and will be specified in the applicable pricing supplement. The "spread" is the number of basis points (one one-hundredth of a percentage point) specified in the applicable pricing supplement to be added to or subtracted from the base rate for a floating rate note. The "spread multiplier" is the percentage specified in the applicable pricing supplement to be applied to the base rate for a floating rate note.

LIMITATIONS ON INTEREST RATE. A floating rate note may also have either or both of the following limitations on the interest rate:

- o a maximum limitation, or ceiling, on the rate of interest which may

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accrue during any interest period, which we refer to as the "maximum interest rate";

- o a minimum limitation, or floor, on the rate of interest that may accrue during any interest period, which we refer to as the "minimum interest rate."

Any applicable maximum interest rate or minimum interest rate will be set forth in the applicable pricing supplement.

In addition, the interest rate on a floating rate note may not be higher than the maximum rate permitted by New York law, as that rate may be modified by United States law of general application. Under current New York law, the maximum rate of interest, subject to some exceptions, for any loan in an amount less than \$250,000 is 16% and for any loan in the amount of \$250,000 or more but less than \$2,500,000 is 25% per annum on a simple interest basis. These limits do not apply to loans of \$2,500,000 or more.

HOW FLOATING INTEREST RATES ARE RESET. The interest rate in effect from the date of issue to the first interest reset date for a floating rate note will be the initial interest rate specified in the applicable pricing supplement. We refer to this rate as the "initial interest rate." The interest rate on each floating rate note may be reset daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, semiannually or annually. This period is the "interest reset period" and the first day of each interest reset period is the "interest reset date." The "interest determination date" for any interest reset date is the day the calculation agent identified in the applicable pricing supplement will refer to when determining the new interest rate at which a floating rate will reset, and is applicable as follows (unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement):

- o for CD rate notes, commercial paper rate notes, federal funds rate notes, prime rate notes and CMT rate notes, the interest determination date will be the second business day prior to the interest reset date;
- o for EURIBOR notes or Euro LIBOR notes, the interest determination date will be the second TARGET Settlement Day, as defined above under "-- General Terms of Notes -- Some Definitions," prior to the interest reset date;
- o for LIBOR notes (other than Euro LIBOR notes), the interest determination date will be the second London banking day prior to the interest reset date, except that the interest determination date pertaining to an interest reset date for a LIBOR note for which the index currency is pounds sterling will be the interest reset date; and
- o for Treasury rate notes, the interest determination date will be the day of the week in which the interest reset date falls on which Treasury bills would normally be auctioned.

Treasury bills are normally sold at auction on Monday of each week, unless that day is a legal holiday, in which case the auction is normally held on the following Tuesday, but the auction may be held on the preceding Friday. If, as the result of a legal holiday, the auction is held on the preceding Friday, that Friday will be the interest determination date pertaining to the interest reset date occurring in the next succeeding week. If an auction falls on a day that is an interest reset date, that interest reset date will be the next following business day.

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The interest reset dates will be specified in the applicable pricing supplement. If an interest reset date for any floating rate note falls on a day that is not a business day, it will be postponed to the following business day, except that, in the case of a EURIBOR note or a LIBOR note, if that business day is in the next calendar month, the interest reset date will be the immediately preceding business day.

The interest rate in effect for the ten calendar days immediately prior to maturity, redemption or repayment will be the one in effect on the tenth calendar day preceding the maturity, redemption or repayment date.

In the detailed descriptions of the various base rates which follow, the "calculation date" pertaining to an interest determination date means the earlier of (1) the tenth calendar day after that interest determination date, or, if that day is not a business day, the next succeeding business day, and (2) the business day preceding the applicable interest payment date or maturity date or, for any principal amount to be redeemed or repaid, any redemption or repayment date.

HOW INTEREST IS CALCULATED. Interest on floating rate notes will accrue from and including the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, or, if no interest has been paid or duly provided for, from and including the issue date or any other date specified in a pricing supplement on which interest begins to accrue. Interest will accrue to but excluding the next interest payment date or, if earlier, the date on which the

principal has been paid or duly made available for payment, except as described below under "If a Payment Date is Not a Business Day."

The applicable pricing supplement will specify a calculation agent for any issue of floating rate notes. Upon the request of the holder of any floating rate note, the calculation agent will provide the interest rate then in effect and, if determined, the interest rate that will become effective on the next interest reset date for that floating rate note.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, for a floating rate note, accrued interest will be calculated by multiplying the principal amount of the floating rate note by an accrued interest factor. This accrued interest factor will be computed by adding the interest factors calculated for each day in the period for which interest is being paid. The interest factor for each day is computed by DIVIDING the interest rate applicable to that day:

- o by 360, in the case of CD rate notes, commercial paper rate notes, EURIBOR notes, federal funds rate notes, LIBOR notes (except for LIBOR notes denominated in pounds sterling) and prime rate notes;
- o by 365, in the case of LIBOR notes denominated in pounds sterling; or
- o by the actual number of days in the year, in the case of Treasury rate notes and CMT rate notes.

For these calculations, the interest rate in effect on any interest reset date will be the applicable rate as reset on that date. The interest rate applicable to any other day is the interest rate from the immediately preceding interest reset date or, if none, the initial interest rate.

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All percentages used in or resulting from any calculation of the rate of interest on a floating rate note will be rounded, if necessary, to the nearest one hundred-thousandth of a percentage point (with 0.000005% rounded up to 0.00001%), and all U.S. dollar amounts used in or resulting from these calculations on floating rate notes will be rounded to the nearest cent (with one-half cent rounded upward). All Japanese Yen amounts used in or resulting from these calculations will be rounded downwards to the next lower whole Japanese Yen amount. All amounts denominated in any other currency used in or resulting from these calculations will be rounded to the nearest two decimal places in that currency with 0.005 being rounded upward.

WHEN INTEREST IS PAID. We will pay interest on floating rate notes on the interest payment dates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. However, if the first interest payment date is less than 15 days after the date of issuance, interest will not be paid on the first interest payment date, but will be paid on the second interest payment date.

IF A PAYMENT DATE IS NOT A BUSINESS DAY. If any scheduled interest payment date, other than the maturity date or any earlier redemption or repayment date, for any floating rate note falls on a day that is not a business day, it will be postponed to the following business day, except that, in the case of a EURIBOR note or a LIBOR note, if that business day would fall in the next calendar month, the interest payment date will be the immediately preceding business day. If the scheduled maturity date or any earlier redemption or repayment date of a floating rate note falls on a day that is not a business day, the payment of principal, premium, if any, and interest, if any, will be made on the next succeeding business day, but interest on that payment will not accrue during the period from and after the maturity, redemption or repayment date.

BASE RATE NOTES

CD RATE NOTES

CD rate notes will bear interest at the interest rates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. Those interest rates will be based on the CD rate and any spread and/or spread multiplier and will be subject to the minimum interest rate and the maximum interest rate, if any.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the "CD rate" means, for any interest determination date, the rate on that date for negotiable certificates of deposit having the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement as published by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in

"Statistical Release H.15(519), Selected Interest Rates," or any successor publication of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System ("H.15(519)") under the heading "CDs (Secondary Market)."

The following procedures will be followed if the CD rate cannot be determined as described above:

- o If the above rate is not published in H.15(519) by 9:00 a.m., New York City time, on the calculation date, the CD rate will be the rate on that interest determination date set forth in the daily update of H.15(519), available through the world wide website of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System at

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<http://www.federalreserve.gov/releases/h15/update>, or any successor site or publication, which is commonly referred to as the "H.15 Daily Update," for the interest determination date for certificates of deposit having the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement, under the caption "CDs (Secondary Market)."

- o If the above rate is not yet published in either H.15(519) or the H.15 Daily Update by 3:00 p.m., New York City time, on the calculation date, the calculation agent will determine the CD rate to be the arithmetic mean of the secondary market offered rates as of 10:00 a.m., New York City time, on that interest determination date of three leading nonbank dealers in negotiable U.S. dollar certificates of deposit in The City of New York selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with us, for negotiable certificates of deposit of major United States money center banks of the highest credit standing in the market for negotiable certificates of deposit with a remaining maturity closest to the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement in an amount that is representative for a single transaction in that market at that time.
- o If the dealers selected by the calculation agent are not quoting as set forth above, the CD rate for that interest determination date will remain the CD rate for the immediately preceding interest reset period, or, if there was no interest reset period, the rate of interest payable will be the initial interest rate.

COMMERCIAL PAPER RATE NOTES

Commercial paper rate notes will bear interest at the interest rates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. Those interest rates will be based on the commercial paper rate and any spread and/or spread multiplier and will be subject to the minimum interest rate and the maximum interest rate, if any.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the "commercial paper rate" means, for any interest determination date, the money market yield, calculated as described below, of the rate on that date for commercial paper having the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement, as that rate is published in H.15(519), under the heading "Commercial Paper -- Nonfinancial."

The following procedures will be followed if the commercial paper rate cannot be determined as described above:

- o If the above rate is not published by 9:00 a.m., New York City time, on the calculation date, then the commercial paper rate will be the money market yield of the rate on that interest determination date for commercial paper of the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement as published in the H.15 Daily Update under the heading "Commercial Paper -- Nonfinancial."
- o If by 3:00 p.m., New York City time, on that calculation date the rate is not yet published in either H.15(519) or the H.15 Daily Update, then the calculation agent will determine the commercial paper rate to be the money market yield of the arithmetic mean of the offered rates as of 11:00 a.m., New York City time, on that interest determination date of three leading dealers of commercial paper in The City of New York selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with us, for commercial paper of the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement, placed for an industrial issuer whose bond rating is "AA," or the equivalent, from a nationally recognized statistical rating agency.

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- o If the dealers selected by the calculation agent are not quoting as set forth above, the commercial paper rate for that interest determination date will remain the commercial paper rate for the immediately preceding

interest reset period, or, if there was no interest reset period, the rate of interest payable will be the initial interest rate.

The "money market yield" will be a yield calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$\text{money market yield} = \frac{D \times 360}{360 - (D \times M)} \times 100$$

where "D" refers to the applicable per year rate for commercial paper quoted on a bank discount basis and expressed as a decimal and "M" refers to the actual number of days in the interest period for which interest is being calculated.

EURIBOR NOTES

EURIBOR notes will bear interest at the interest rates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. That interest rate will be based on EURIBOR and any spread and/or spread multiplier and will be subject to the minimum interest rate and the maximum interest rate, if any.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, "EURIBOR" means, for any interest determination date, the rate for deposits in euros as sponsored, calculated and published jointly by the European Banking Federation and ACI -- The Financial Market Association, or any company established by the joint sponsors for purposes of compiling and publishing those rates, for the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement as that rate appears on the display on Reuters, or any successor service, on page EURIBOR01 or any other page as may replace page EURIBOR01 on that service, which is commonly referred to as "Reuters Page EURIBOR01," as of 11:00 a.m. (Brussels time).

The following procedures will be followed if the rate cannot be determined as described above:

- o If the above rate does not appear, the calculation agent will request the principal Euro-zone office of each of four major banks in the Euro-zone interbank market, as selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with us, to provide the calculation agent with its offered rate for deposits in euros, at approximately 11:00 a.m. (Brussels time) on the interest determination date, to prime banks in the Euro-zone interbank market for the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement commencing on the applicable interest reset date, and in a principal amount not less than the equivalent of U.S.\$1 million in euro that is representative of a single transaction in euro, in that market at that time. If at least two quotations are provided, EURIBOR will be the arithmetic mean of those quotations.
- o If fewer than two quotations are provided, EURIBOR will be the arithmetic mean of the rates quoted by four major banks in the Euro-zone, as selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with

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us, at approximately 11:00 a.m. (Brussels time), on the applicable interest reset date for loans in euro to leading European banks for a period of time equivalent to the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement commencing on that interest reset date in a principal amount not less than the equivalent of U.S.\$1 million in euro.

- o If the banks so selected by the calculation agent are not quoting as set forth above, EURIBOR for that interest determination date will remain EURIBOR for the immediately preceding interest reset period, or, if there was no interest reset period, the rate of interest will be the initial interest rate.

"Euro-zone" means the region comprised of member states of the European Union that adopt the single currency in accordance with the treaty establishing the European Community, as amended by the treaty on European Union.

FEDERAL FUNDS RATE NOTES

Federal funds rate notes will bear interest at the interest rates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. Those interest rates will be based on the federal funds rate and any spread and/or spread multiplier and will be subject to the minimum interest rate and the maximum interest rate, if any.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, "federal funds rate" means, for any interest determination date, the rate on that date for federal funds as published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release H.15(519) under the heading "Federal Funds (Effective)" as displayed on Reuters or any successor service, on page FEDFUNDS1 or any other page as may replace the applicable page on that service, which is commonly referred to as "Reuters Page FEDFUNDS1." For the avoidance of doubt, the federal funds rate for any interest determination date is the rate published for the immediately preceding business day.

The following procedures will be followed if the federal funds rate cannot be determined as described above:

- o If the above rate is not published by 9:00 a.m., New York City time, on the calculation date, the federal funds rate will be the rate on that interest determination date as published in the H.15 Daily Update under the heading "Federal Funds/Effective Rate."
- o If the above rate is not yet published in either H.15(519) or the H.15 Daily Update by 3:00 p.m., New York City time, on the calculation date, the calculation agent will determine the federal funds rate to be the arithmetic mean of the rates for the last transaction in overnight federal funds by each of three leading brokers of federal funds transactions in The City of New York selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with us, prior to 9:00 a.m., New York City time, on that interest determination date.
- o If the brokers selected by the calculation agent are not quoting as set forth above, the federal funds rate for that interest determination date will be the federal funds rate last in effect on the interest determination date.

LIBOR NOTES

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LIBOR notes will bear interest at the interest rates specified in the applicable pricing supplement. That interest rate will be based on London interbank offered rate, which is commonly referred to as "LIBOR," and any spread and/or spread multiplier and will be subject to the minimum interest rate and the maximum interest rate, if any.

Unless otherwise specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the calculation agent will determine "LIBOR" for each interest determination date as follows:

- o As of the interest determination date, LIBOR will be either:
 - o if "LIBOR Reuters" is specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the arithmetic mean of the offered rates for deposits in the index currency having the index maturity designated in the applicable pricing supplement, as of that interest determination date, that appear on the Designated LIBOR Page, as defined below, as of 11:00 a.m., London time, on that interest determination date, if at least two offered rates appear on the Designated LIBOR Page; except that if the specified Designated LIBOR Page, by its terms provides only for a single rate, that single rate will be used; or
 - o if "LIBOR Bloomberg" is specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the rate for deposits in the index currency having the index maturity designated in the applicable pricing supplement, as of that interest determination date or, if pounds sterling is the index currency, commencing on that interest determination date, that appears on the Designated LIBOR Page at approximately 11:00 a.m., London time, on that interest determination date.
- o If (1) fewer than two offered rates appear and "LIBOR Reuters" is specified in the applicable pricing supplement, or (2) no rate appears and the applicable pricing supplement specifies either (x) "LIBOR Bloomberg" or (y) "LIBOR Reuters" and the Designated LIBOR Page by its terms provides only for a single rate, then the calculation agent will request the principal London offices of each of four major reference banks in the London interbank market, as selected by the calculation agent after consultation with us, to provide the calculation agent with its offered quotation for deposits in the index currency for the period of the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement as of that interest determination date or, if pounds sterling is the index currency, commencing on that interest determination date, to prime banks in the London interbank market at approximately 11:00 a.m., London time, on that interest determination date and

in a principal amount that is representative of a single transaction in that index currency in that market at that time.

- o If at least two quotations are provided, LIBOR determined on that interest determination date will be the arithmetic mean of those quotations. If fewer than two quotations are provided, LIBOR will be determined for the applicable interest reset date as the arithmetic mean of the rates quoted at approximately 11:00 a.m., London time, or some other time specified in the applicable pricing supplement, in the applicable principal financial center for the country of the index currency on that interest reset date, by three major banks in that

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principal financial center selected by the calculation agent, after consultation with us, for loans in the index currency to leading European banks, having the index maturity specified in the applicable pricing supplement and in a principal amount that is representative of a single transaction in that index currency in that market at that time.

- o If the banks so selected by the calculation agent are not quoting as set forth above, LIBOR for that interest determination date will remain LIBOR for the immediately preceding interest reset period, or, if there was no interest reset period, the rate of interest payable will be the initial interest rate.

The "index currency" means the currency specified in the applicable pricing supplement as the currency for which LIBOR will be calculated, or, if the euro is substituted for that currency, the index currency will be the euro. If that currency is not specified in the applicable pricing supplement, the index currency will be U.S. dollars.

"Designated LIBOR Page" means either (a) if "LIBOR Reuters" is designated in the applicable pricing supplement, the display on Reuters for the purpose of displaying the London interbank rates of major banks for the applicable index currency or its designated successor, or (b) if "LIBOR Bloomberg" is designated in the applicable pricing supplement, the display on Bloomberg or any successor service, page BBAM1
